What difference does the Resurrection make?

- 1. Once bound by fear, now bold in faith (v. 19)
- 2. Once despairing, now rejoicing (v. 20)
- 3. Once confused and uncertain, now comforted and courageous (v. 21)
- 4. Once without hope in this life, now given abundant life in His name (v. 31)
