### How did Jesus fulfill the Law and the Prophets?

- As to the Law: By living a sinless life, Jesus embodied all the OT's moral and ethical demands. In His death on the cross, Jesus fulfilled, once for all, the atoning sacrificial demands of the Law.
- As to the Prophets: All the covenant promises and prophetic predictions of the OT's Messianic hope were/will be fulfilled and realized in the person and work of Jesus.
