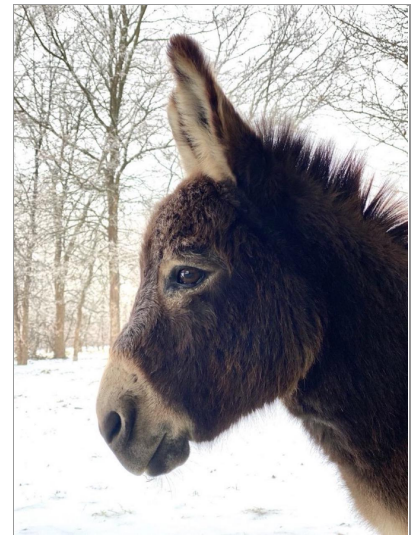
SERMON NOTES
